#### **Foreword**

Approximately 800 students from 26 Higher Educational Institution in the Hyderabad area physically tied "Rakhi" to more than 2000 soldiers from Army, Air Force, and Navy units stationed in Hyderabad and throughout India as a way of showing their love and respect for soldiers. The kids were in a state of euphoria while the soldiers were pleasantly thrilled. They wished each other well at the events hosted at various military locations.

The Hyderabad-based NGO Samskruti Foundation hosts the "Rakhi for Soldiers" program each year to show our love, gratitude, and affection for them as well as to lessen their feelings of missing the Rakhi holiday. Every year on "Shravana Poornima," brothers and sisters celebrate Raksha Bandhan, a holy day on which they reaffirm their unbreakable tie, symbolized by the tying of "Rakhi" by sisters to their brothers. While the general public has plenty of opportunities to enjoy the festival, our warriors frequently miss it because they are performing their national duty and cannot get together with their sisters and families to celebrate.

In the past, female students from 35 engineering colleges in Hyderabad delivered Rakhis along with notes of love and appreciation via postal mail to over 15,000 soldiers stationed in forward locations in order to reach them on time.

The initiative known as Rakhi for Soldiers has been a huge success. We think that everyone who took part in this event has come to understand the importance of soldiers and how they sacrifice their lives for their country. This kind of thinking is sufficient to inspire a sense of nationalism in the younger pupils. If we work to push more people in the right direction and with the correct mindset, our nation's exponential growth will not cease.

An NGO called Samskruti Foundation was founded in 2009 to protect and promote our rich and historic culture by utilizing the youth power of our country. The Foundation organizes a number of annual events in addition to "Rakhi for Soldiers," such as "Yoga for Youth," "Vivek Band," National Science Day, Samskruti Samvad, and other events that focus the youthful energy of our nation on national development and cultural rejuvenation.

By entering into Memorandums of Understanding with prestigious academic institutions to establish "Cultural Leadership Centers" around the nation to support and encourage the practice of our ancient culture abroad, the Samskruti Foundation is also extending its activities nationally.

#### **Introduction of Rakhi for Soldiers**

Raksha Bandhan festival celebrates the unique bond between a brother and his sister. The festival is observed on the full-moon day or Purnima in the Hindu calendar month of Shravan. This year Rakhi festival celebrated on 30th August 2023. The tying of the Rakhi depicts the unconditional faith the sister has in her brother. She also prays for his long life. Sisters also apply a 'tilak' on the forehead of the brothers. The story of Raksha Bandhan is related to the Hindu epic Mahabharata. In Mahabharata, Lord Krishna once cut his finger which then started bleeding. Seeing this Draupadi then tore a piece of cloth from her saree and tied it on his finger to stop the bleeding. The piece of cloth then became a sacred thread. The act of Draupadi tying a piece of cloth on Krishna's wounded finger is synonymous with Raksha Bandhan — a girl tying Rakhi on her brother's wrist and he, in turn, promising to protect her just as Krishna protected Draupadi.

Rakhi for Soldiers (RFS) is an activity to encourage female students from higher education institutions to express their gratitude for the outstanding contributions, sacrifices, and bravery of our Soldiers.

# Sending rakhis to Foreword areas.

The Rakhi for Soldiers program involved sending Rakhis from female students, who also participated in a signature campaign. Students from 30 colleges in Hyderabad and colleges from Telangana took part in this event.

The purpose of the "Rakhi for Soldiers" program is to honor and recognize Indian soldiers by delivering and tying Rakhi, a traditional Indian thread bracelet, to them. The festival of Raksha Bandhan. The Hindu celebration of Raksha Bandhan honors the special friendship and mutual protection shared by brothers and sisters. Rakhi for Soldiers gives civilians a chance to demonstrate their appreciation and solidarity with the Armed Forces.

There is an impending need for students of the modern higher education system to appreciate our cultural values and make these values stronger through their contribution. Festivals, rituals, and cultural programs are platforms through which these objectives can be reached. Raksha Bandhan is one such festival that cuts across barriers and teaches universal love and brotherhood. Samskruti Foundation takes pride in organizing cultural bridges that connect students with their cultural roots.

This year, Raksha Bandhan was celebrated with the Armed forces and was an overwhelming event. Students across the country participated in the gratitude letters campaign, sent Rakhis, and also went to the border areas and cantonments to tie the Rakhis. The outcome was overwhelming as Soldiers expressed their gratitude and sense of belonging. This has motivated the students also to organize more such events with the support of the faculty members and develop respect and appreciation for our country's cultural heritage.
