MAHA KUMBH 2025

The Maha Kumbh, is a *Samskritik Jala Utsav* (Ceremonial Water festival) and grand Bharatiya Dharmik pilgrimage acts as a microcosm of Bharat's multifaceted relationship with its river bodies. Eternally Kumbh is a confluence (*Sangama*) of all the cultures in the universe symbolising the flow of humanity as a path of enlightenment through communion of nature and spiritual conscience. The Maha Kumbh at Prayag is widely considered the most significant Samskritik Jala Utsav as the source of light and knowledge. This vibrant Dharmik event transcends mere religious/ ritual observance, serving as a confluence of cultures and a catalyst for spiritual awakening. The Maha Kumbh provides a unique stage where the intricate interplay between rivers and society unfolds through a rich tapestry of legends, rituals, beliefs, and practices. These elements passed down through generations, define the profound connection between people and rivers, encompassing the complex web of civilizational dynamics that influence rivers and their delicate ecosystems.

CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK FOR RESILIENT RIVER REJUVENATION.

- Dṛṣṭi (दृष्टि): Perception towards river and river society ecology.
- Svāmitva (स्वामित्व): Stewardship of rivers and their societies.

ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Samskruti Foundation, in association with the University of Allahabad and Motilal Nehru National Institute of Technology Allahabad, Prayagraj, is organising a national seminar on 'Mahakumbh 2025: Rituals to Resilient River Rejuvenation.

The seminar aims to explore multiple areas within the Maha Kumbh 2025 and Prayagraj covering rivers, their ecological systems, and the civilizations that have flourished along the rivers. These were deemed of particular interest due to their potential to reveal insights about stakeholder relationships with the river and its surroundings. It will examine the policies and practices that influence institutional frameworks for river society research methodologies, strategies, and policy interventions. Additionally, the seminar will investigate citizen/ pilgrim perspectives, practices, and the development of resilient river rejuvenation. This seminar brings together experts, policymakers, academics, and practitioners to explore the intersection of civilization, academic, public policy, and governance.


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AUTHOR GUIDELINES



SUBMIT YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS:

- Articles and viewpoints should be written in English, Hindi or Sanskrit. Authors are advised to choose to have their manuscripts professionally edited before submission, as papers with poor readability will not be accepted.
- Full-length articles should be between 2,500 5,000 words in length (excluding abstract, and references). The article must comprise the research background and relevance of the study, methodology or field survey approach, preliminary results, and conclusions.
- The templates for Full-length articles along with submission guidelines can be downloaded from the seminar website.

REGISTRATION FEE:

 Registration is FREE for all scholarly Full-length articles accepted for presentation and publication in the seminar proceedings.

PUBLICATION:

- All full papers submitted for the seminar will undergo a double-blind review process.
- All accepted full-length articles for the 'National Seminar' will be published in the proceedings book titled 'Mahakumbh 2025: Rituals to Resilient River Rejuvenation'.



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
