

RAKHI FOR SOLDIERS

Raksha Bandhan- the Bond of Protection is a festival celebrated in India during the full moon day of Shravan Maas. Traditionally, in this festival, a Raksha Bandhan (Rakhi) is tied to a brother's wrist by their sister; and brothers pledge to protect and take care of their sisters.

Today, the real protectors of our country are the people who sacrifice their sleep and comforts to protect the nation - the **Soldiers**. Every soldier in the Army is the protector of our comfortable life. With this notion in mind, Samskruti Foundation celebrates 'Rakhi for Soldiers' program every year to motivate the soldiers and show solidarity towards them as they protect the country, away from their families and away from their sisters.



Raksha Bandhan is a traditional festival. In order to promote national consciousness in the common man, Samskruti Foundation works to safeguard the cultural values, ethos, and traditions of Indian society. Samskruti Foundation promotes participation in this programme among female students from various

colleges. Students and Samskruti Foundation volunteers visit various Army units to present rakhi to the nation's soldiers.

The main goal of this event is to instill a sense of patriotism in each person through our time-honored cultural customs. The youth of the nation are made more aware of Indian culture, tradition, and national consciousness.

Lt Col Neerada (Retd) took charge of the planning and execution under the direction of Dr. Vivek Modi, Director of Samskruti Foundation, and Sri T Ram Babu, Co-Convener of Samskruti Foundation.

For Raksha Bandhan for Soldiers, Samskruti Foundation organised a number of activities. They are the distribution of Rakhis to military units in the local community, Signature campaign for soldiers, and distribution of Rakhis to be forwarded to the field regions.

Samskruti Foundation contacted colleges and universities and invited 20 students from each to an event that was planned in 7 Army and Air Force units on August 11.

Distribution of Rakhis to Forward and Field Areas

More than 10,000 Rakhis were collected by Samskruti Foundation from higher education institutions across the state of Telangana. Samskruti Foundation interacted with Army officials in the forward regions as soon as it was aware of all the requirements and came up with a strategy to approach them.

Rakhis and Tilak were collected on July 28, 2022, and on July 29, 2022, they were attractively packaged and sent across Indian postal services to various Army units.

Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra

Groups on 'Water Policy' and 'Food Policy' began preliminary work on their respective projects.

A meeting of the three groups of Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra was held with invited speakers, senior functionaries of SAK and SF, and some special invitees at the NSL Corporate Office, Hyderabad. The meeting was conducted in Hybrid mode with about 10 members attending online, while the rest attended in offline mode at the indicated venue.

Shi Rambabu, Co-convener (SF) gave a brief introduction to the background of the meeting. While stressing the need to meet periodically to exchange ideas, he also spoke briefly about the role of SAK.

Professor H. Hemnath Rao spoke on the objectives of SAK, and its structure designed for working in the area of linking our culture to public policy. He explained the formation of three distinct groups in the SAK. He briefed on the two initiatives taken to start work on two areas namely 'Food' and 'Water' Public policies. He also briefed about the plans including the conduct of a conference on the theme - 'Shivaji's Statecraft and its relevance to current times' scheduled in January 2023.

Professor G. Ramesh in his address covered many aspects and attributes of public policy and the relevance of culture to it. He said that work is currently being carried out in India on similar themes in different places in different groups in a disjointed way and there is a need to establish linkages between these different groups. He further made some salient points, which were very informative and interesting. Prof. Ramesh also agreed to review papers prepared by SAK.

During the Q/A session which followed, **Professor Satyanarayana**, **S**. highlighted the importance of ethics in public life and the need to reinforce ethical values. Dr. P Somnath, Prof. Anjal Prakash, and Sri Lalit Abhiram spoke on the composition and activities of groups 1, 2, and 3 and also identified the members to constitute the subgroups for taking up work on water and food policy formulations. **Prof.** Anjal Prasad described the role of Group 2 and highlighted the different areas of work on Water policy. He said that considerable progress has been made already. Two meetings of the subgroup on the water were held for deliberations on relevant aspects of the work.

In his address, Chairman Dr. C. Umamaheswara Rao began by stressing the importance of ethics as a value to be inherited from the past. He brought to the fore the introduction of the ethics component into the new education policy based on the experience of teaching moral values in the Vidya Bharati group of schools which is tantamount to their inclusion in public policy. He further said that it is important to look at our past to draw inspiration from and take pride in and incorporate its positive aspects into our lives. He advised SAK to set its benchmarks for carrying out and reporting work.

He complimented Professor G. Ramesh for his excellent exposition on Public Policy. He also invited those present to contribute their mite to SAK's path-breaking work.
