


Calling Samskruti Foundation Cultural Leadership Centres Promote Goodness, Empathy and Social Well-being



Let us behave like cultural leaders – emphasized Dr. Vivek Modi, Director Cultural Leadership Centre, Samskruti Foundation, Motivational Speaker and Wellness Expert. Samskruti Foundation has two verticals – one works with the educational institutions across the country through Cultural Leadership Centres (CLCs); and the other is the research-oriented wing – the Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra where research on ancient Indian culture and its impact on policies are studied.

The CLCs are representatives of Samskruti Foundation in colleges. They work in teams of 10 and 1 faculty towards the vision and mission of Samskruti Foundation. The core vision is to promote and understand and inculcate the ethos and culture of India through practices. These CLCs conduct 5 main activities - Vivekband - Be Good Do Good. Let us make the world know that there are lot of good people around. Let goodness make the sound. Youth should take the responsibility and show that as much as there is negativity around, being good and doing good is the way of life that will ultimately conquer negativity with positivity. The birthdays of Swami Vivekananda and Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose are commemorated with these activities. The second activity is observing National Science Day (February 28), which marks the discovery of the Raman effect by Indian physicist Sir C. V. Raman. Institutions visit several national institutions of importance and scientific

establishments, where they interact with scientists and explore future career opportunities. The third is Yoga Day (Yoga for Youth, June 21), and fourth is Raksha



Bandhan for soldiers, where students send and tie Rakhis to soldiers on the borders and in the nearby cantonments, expressing solidarity and compassion with them. These four are once a year activity, while the fifth is Samvad. Debates are conducted on Indian culture and national importance. These debates help in understanding nuances of communication, logic and expression. The activities are not just limited to these five.

There are colleges across the country celebrating and understanding festivals, games, food, toys and other cultural traditions of India. We are in alignment with the cultural traditions of India. We do not believe in exploitation of nature but in milking nature. For the first time CLCs are doing these activities and it is very encouraging.

What is the differentiating factor between a CLC team leader and any other student leader? If you want to be a cultural leader, you will imbibe characteristics that will not only help becoming cultural leaders but also excellent professionals in their careers. They need to have the ability to work unsupervised without handholding. They also have the ability to certify the completion of their work. Cultural leaders take responsibility, finish the

work and gain the confidence of their supervisors. Such characteristics will help them become successful in their careers.

Birds move in large numbers but always maintain a pattern while flying. We can also do that. We all talk about the greatness of our country. What is this greatness? This country has survived many onslaughts, aggression and lootings from outside. There were several attempts to convert the country into other religions. Inspite of all these, we stand today as a proud Hindu nation. This has not happened by accident. This is because we have been maintaining our cultural identity and integrity irrespective of the variations across the regions. Therefore, there is a reason for us to understand the reason behind our greatness. Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra helps in digging

into our past to study various aspects of our culture. There are 47 departments in the Government of India which take decisions on various subjects. Our idea is to assist the Government by giving impactful and meaningful inputs so that they can take policy decisions. Our knowledgebase, our usefulness, our practices, our principles in helping policy making is the main objective of Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra. I pay my respects to our volunteers who have done voluminous work in taking forward Samskruti Foundation's mission. Infact, this country has benefitted by a great deal of voluntary work which gets done silently.

The recent seminar on Chhatrapati Shivaji's Statecraft and the lessons for modern India at Srisailam was attended by dignitaries and eminent scholars from different states and universities. The deliberations gave the outcome that a global research centre should be set up so that more research can be done about Shivaji. Hence, Chhatrapati Chhatrapati Shivaji can become an international icon. We have lot of upcoming activities, and also intend to publish books on our Indian culture which would influence the countrymen.

There are many areas on which knowledge is not available and we know only about the tip of the iceberg. Samskruti Talks aims to organize talks on various cultural topics with few eminent scholars as moderators in groups of about 50 people for smooth transmission of intellectual information. Faculty from educational institutions can come forward and take forward this agenda in their institutions by organizing **Samskruti Talks.** Cultural Leadership Centres are the visible agenda of Samskruti Adhyayana Kendra.




We are exposed to western culture and it is not possible to stop the influence in this age of the internet and technology. At the same time should know what happened in this country and what should happen to this country. Our Prime Minister is currently the President of the G-20 nations. We are now going to expose to the other countries what is good about our country. A delegation is going across each state finding out the key and specific aspects of each state which will be put forth in front of the world at large. Our country is progressing in the right direction. So, we need to understand what is this progress, and where this

progress is taking us. Our future is in our hands.

We see that the aggressions meted out to our country are highlighted more than the resistance put forth by our country. This resistance is what has helped us become one in our fights and made us stand as united India. We have come out with three text books with CBSE syllabus for 6th, 7th, and 8th classes. These text books are now being used in CBSE schools in Chennai. These text books, prepared by Vidya Bharati Shiksha Sansthan and Chinmaya Mission, took the efforts of 200 teachers to study and rewrite them and 2 years to complete. We are optimistic that this will spread to other parts of the country as well.

The New Education Policy 2020 received more than 2 lakh suggestions and efforts are on way to come out with text books. This year text books using the NEP 2020 suggestions are coming out for pre primary to second class. Text books are coming out also for classes 1-5 years (foundation course). We look forward to imbibe our cultural aspects and come out with a Bharat-centric education. NEP 2020 is tuned to the needs of the country and future education needs to align itself to it. We need to dig into the past but not live in the past. Use the past to launch yourself into the future. Whatever career you choose, the practices of today will help you keep vibrant.

Culture is empowerment. You need spiritual culture to become successful leaders, asserted Swami Shitikanthananda Ji. He emphasized on the power of silence to overcome obstacles in life. Silence is Yoga, he said. It is difficult to practice. But if you practice, nothing is difficult. Our forefathers perfected the art of meditation (tapasya) to crack the mystery of the universe. A scattered mind will not achieve greatness in life.

Animals do not have culture. There is no good or bad tiger. Culture is a powerful word. *Samskruti heenaha, pashubhi samanaha...*A man devoid of culture is like an animal as culture is the differentiating factor between human beings and animals.

Animals follow instinct while human beings follow intellect (buddhi). We can differentiate between good and bad. People indulging in bad habits (alcohol addiction, drug abuse) know it is wrong intellectually but are not able to overcome due to their weak spiritual and cultural strength. That is why we need culture. Culture is empowerment.

Youth are the backbone of the nation. The nation's progress and prosperity depends on the youth's goals and aspirations. Unfortunately, training of the mind is not

focused upon in colleges today. When you have culture, you have concentration. When you have concentration, you have confidence. When you have concentration and confidence you have skill. When you have skill you will acquire great jobs and subsequently wealth. Today we remember and draw inspiration from Swami Vivekananda and Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose because they exuded confidence and were successful in influencing people. We experienced political colonization under the British. But today, we are experiencing cultural colonization due to the advent of the internet. The internet has made the whole world one global village. Technological integration is okay, but cultural integration is not okay. If cultural colonization should take place, then Indian culture is the only culture that can be adopted for the entire world.



India has been the cultural and spiritual capital of the world for ages. We experience cultural shocks when we go abroad. We truly comprehend our great Indian culture when we step outside of India. When asked how he would feel after going to India after his sojourn in America, Swami Vivekananda said that he realized more than before that the Indian soil and air itself reek of spirituality and culture.

We do not understand our superior knowledgebase and culture until we are exposed to the cultures of the other lands. Samskruti Foundation's initiative to create Cultural Leadership Centres is really laudable. "There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of women is improved. It is not possible for a bird to fly on only one wing," said Swami Vivekananda. The highest goal a woman can have is "how can I become a great mother?" The ideal of womanhood in India is motherhood. India is mother-centric society. In India 2 million children are born every year with congenital disorders, 1.7 children are born pre-term. A child born with birth defects has irreversible damage. This is mainly due to the fact that the mother while bearing the child underwent serious stress and psychological problems.

Our **Aaryajanani** programs promote a healthy prenatal lifestyle for the mothers-to-be. A woman needs the unstinted love and support of family, especially the husband, when pregnant. When the woman is exposed to stress, she gives birth to congenital or deformed infants. Women need to be empowered culturally to give birth to good and healthy children. **We need to promote cultural nationalism and spiritual socialism**.

Culture enhances a human being's capacities. We are exposed to so many temptations as well as knowledge resources due to the internet. Youth need to guard themselves against these temptations. Please study Swami Vivekananda and make him your idol, your friend, philosopher and guide of your life to overcome the tribulations of your life. You can enhance your life by making Swamiji your companion. "All power is within you; you can do anything and everything", said Swamiji.

These quotes serve as capsules to the mind. Fill your mind with positive thoughts. There is only problem in life, no multiple problems. The only problem is that our thoughts and emotions are not in sync with the way we want them. We need to give a concrete expression to our thoughts and emotions. To express your thoughts and emotions consciously and mastery over your thoughts, culture is required. Conquer yourself and conquer the world. Unless you empower yourself spiritually and culturally all these words of success and greatness are fake. India's environment is in alignment with culture. Countries like USA spend trillions of dollars on health. There is almost a mental pandemic going on there.

Outwardly simple, inwardly profound – that is our culture. Swami Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Swami Ramana Maharshi experienced great richness in their lives. To preserve our environment, our ecology and conserve nature, we need to practice Indian culture as it is the only way we can practice to hand over our legacy to our children of the future. The soul, the consciousness, is the very source of bliss. To preserve environment and provide environment solutions, we need Satwik people. A sustainable society can be created only when we push ourselves in pursuit of inner happiness.
